## The Annual Parish Meeting and Parish Council Elections

### Annual Parish Meeting – 31st March 2011

The Annual Parish Meeting is not a formal parish council meeting, it is your opportunity to come and meet the council and make your voice heard, find out what has been happening in Kings Hill over the past year and suggest ideas for the next.

There will be an opportunity to meet the councillors informally and view displays from local groups including the Youth Club, Heath Farm, Football Club and Skate Park from 7pm. A Q&A session with the council will run from 8pm.

Please come and join us from **7pm** on **Thursday 31st March** at the Community Centre.

### Parish Council elections

Elections will be held on **Thursday 5th May**. Polling stations will be at Kings Hill Community Centre and Discovery School.

Are you interested in standing for election and becoming a parish councillor? There are 12 seats on the council filled by residents of the parish. No experience is required, just enthusiasm and a desire to improve Kings Hill. Nomination papers for parish councillors are now available and can be obtained from the TMBC offices in Gibson Drive. ## Heath Farm

### New Planning Application

The planning application for the Sports and Leisure Facility to be built at Heath Farm was submitted to Tonbridge and Malling Planning by Liberty Property Trust (LPT) in late February. The plans have just been released for public inspection and comment as we went to press. The plans include a sports pavilion, 5 grass pitches, one artificial pitch and allotments.

The plans will be displayed for residents to view at the Kings Hill Annual Parish Meeting on 31st March 2011. The plans will also be discussed at one of our Parish Council meetings in March or April. Please check our website regularly for updates.

## The Central Retail Area

The plans submitted by LPT propose that the Grade II listed control tower includes a Project Space (Cultural Centre). The planning application includes details of how this space may be used.

"The project space would not become a conventional gallery but become part of the wider Kings Hill Cultural Strategy, linking architecture, permanent artworks and temporary exhibitions into an active

residential/retail area and cultural hub. The main operator for the Project Space would potentially be the "University of Creative Arts."

The Parish Council have written to LPT asking for a meeting to discuss the future use of the Project Space. KHPC would like to be considered as an operator of this space.

The Skate Park Working Group recently met to review the Park Project. It was agreed that KHPC would write to LPT and KCC asking for an alternative site to be considered for the Skate Park. This site, if agreed, would significantly reduce the cost of installing the base and the overall project.

In the near future the Parish Council will be conducting a survey of Kings Hill residents to determine the level of support for the facility. This data is essential for any funding applications. # On Discovery Drive

## Pedestrian Crossing. . .

The Parish Council has received an interim report on the installation of a Toucan Crossing in Discovery Drive which will be located between Alexander Grove and Goldings Close. The design and final costings will be sent to County Councillor Richard Long and KHPC by the end of March. It is likely that the report will be presented at KHPC Full Council on 20th April 2011.

## And a new Bus Shelter

A unanimous decision was taken by KHPC Full Council in 2008 to reinstate the bus shelter. Due to circumstances beyond this councils control, installation has been severely delayed. It is now hoped that the new shelter will be installed before September 2011. KHPC has funds available and will also be applying for grants to meet any short fall in expenditure.



## Salt bins / gritting update Snow Clearance on Kings Hill

In addition to the gritting and snow clearance organized by Kent Highway Services ( KHS), and Kings Hill Residential Estate Management Company (KHREMC) the Parish Council are planning to install

some salt bins around the village before next winter. The Parish Council applied to KHS for salt bins last summer but none of the locations we submitted passed the criteria set by KHS in its new operational policy.

A number of roads have been identified as high priorities. KHPC will start installing salt bins before winter 2011. The Parish Council would like to hear from residents who can identify an area not on the highway or pavements where a salt bin could be located. Email office@kingshillparish.gov.uk.
