Dear Paul

Possible Health and Safety Risk from footway encroaching foliage Anson Avenue, Kings Hill

The site is under the management of Liberty Property Trust. I would be grateful if you could look at the attached photographs. The area concerned is the 'wild growth' site on the left side at the start of Anson Avenue from the roundabout.

In the last few years, LWRA has had conversations and correspondence with Liberty about the standard of management of this site. We seek only that it should receive the same level of attention from Liberty that is given to the rest of the Kings Hill landscape under their control. 'Wilding' of any site may be understandable, but residents have objected to the concept being allowed to extend across the paved area.

As matters stand currently, the foliage outgrowth is not simply unsightly but, more importantly, the fast-growing general greenery *including thorny brambles* is now liable to become a cause of minor injury to pedestrians generally, and certainly to children running or riding their bicycles along this area of the pedestrian/cycling path.

Is there something that can be done about this from your perspective?
